On October 26th, the Firelands Historical Society presented its second annual Halloween event,



"Spirits of the Museum". Tours were given every ten minutes to visitors. The guests were treated to different vignettes in the rooms of the museum.

On the first floor, Anna Bristol portrayed Sally DeForest Benedict, wife of Norwalk's founder Platt Benedict, in the parlor. Eric Ebinger presented Charles Wickham, son of the home owner Fred Wickham, in the dining room. DeEtte Zimmerman, dressed as charming witch, guided the guests to the basement, where they encountered Dan Rood, portraying Dr. Gill, who practiced in Norwalk. In the gun room, there

was an encounter with Dr. DeWolf, portrayed by Matt Burr, who told the story of the good doctor's demise at the Little Big Horn. Guests ascended to the second floor of the house, and Sally Jenkins detailed mysteries of of objects in the house, including the story of Chief Ogontz. Chris Harlan and Bill Knadler took care of admissions and greeting the guests. Refreshments were provided by event organizer, Kathleen Schaffer.

There was an excellent turnout and each guest walked away experiencing "mystery in history."
