

#### Known as the John D. Davis collection

(Glouster, Ohio), this assemblage of Native American artifacts consists of approximately 501 small projectile points, 26 large projectile points, and 3 stone/ceramic human effigies. The bulk of the collection ranges in age from Early Archaic to late Woodland, and originates from prehistoric habitation sites in central Ohio, though some of the artifacts may have originated from other locations.
